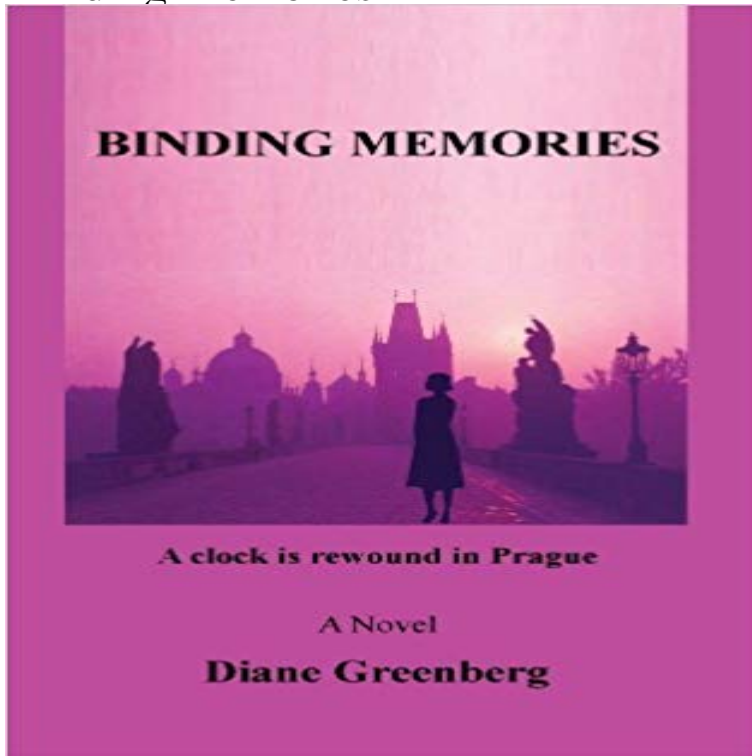


Binding Memories
