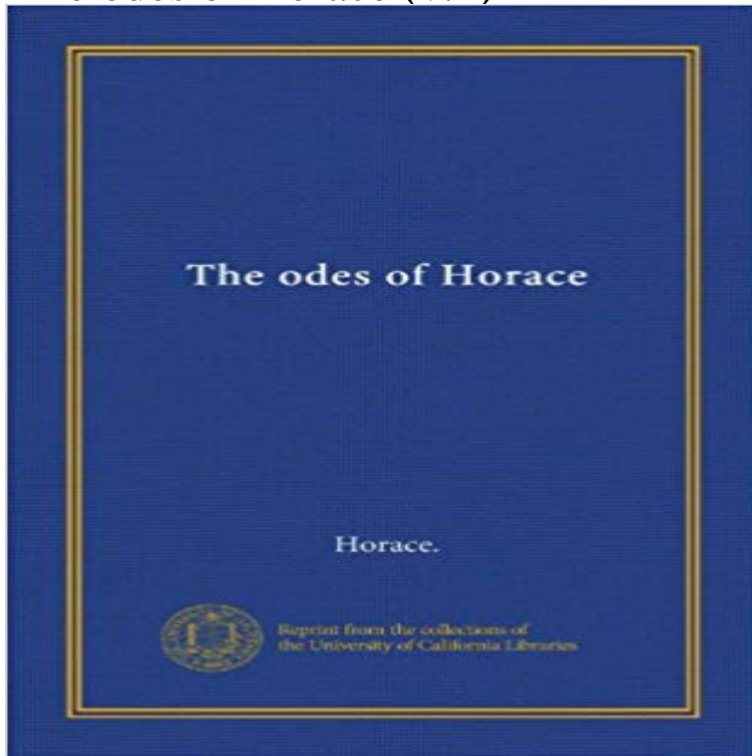


## The odes of Horace (v.2)
